MOTION To Approve February 3, 2025, Board of Trustees Meeting Minutes was moved by Trustee Osborn, seconded by Trustee Hogue, with all in favor.

SET PUBLIC HEARING:

RESOLUTION NO. 027 OF 2025

AUTHORIZING SETTING A PUBLIC HEARING ON A LOCAL LAW TO ESTABLISH SEWER RENTS AND WATER RATES FOR THE 2026 FISCAL YEAR

BE IT ENACTED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Suffern as follows:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Village of Suffern that a public hearing is hereby scheduled for April 7, 2025, at 7:05 P.M. on a proposed a Local Law amending section 220-44 of the Code of the Village of Suffern to establish sewer rents for the 2025-26 fiscal year and amending section 261-15 of the Code of the Village of Suffern to establish water rates for the 2025-26 physical year.

**RESOLUTION NO. 028 OF 2025
AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD ON APRIL 7, 2025, TO
CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF THE 2025-2026 TENTATIVE BUDGET**

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Village Law Section 5-508 (3), a public hearing will be held on April 7, 2025, at 7:10 P.M., by the Village of Suffern Board of Trustees at Village Hall, located at 61 Washington Avenue, Suffern, New York, to consider the adoption of the 2025-2026 Tentative Budget for the Village of Suffern for the fiscal year beginning June 1, 2025, and ending May 31, 2026.

A motion to approve the foregoing resolution was made by Trustee Alpert and seconded by Trustee Osborn with all in favor.

Mayor Curley explained that the fine currently is ineffective and the Board wants to set a minimum. It is, he explained, to keep quality of life a priority. The Board is making the minimum fine \$250.

**RESOLUTION NO. 029 OF 2025
AUTHORIZING A PUBLIC HEARING TO BE HELD ON APRIL 7, 2025, TO
CONSIDER THE ADOPTION OF LOCAL LAW TO AMEND § 73-6 OF THE CODE OF
THE VILLAGE OF SUFFERN REGARDING FINES FOR VIOLATIONS OF THE
ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES CHAPTER OF THE CODE OF THE VILLAGE OF
SUFFERN**

RESOLVED, that pursuant to Village Law Section 5-508 (3), a public hearing will be held on April 7, 2025, at 7:15 P.M., by the Village of Suffern Board of Trustees at Village Hall, located at 61 Washington Avenue, Suffern, New York, to consider the adoption of the Local Law to amend § 73-6 of the code of the Village of Suffern regarding fines for violations of the alcoholic beverages chapter of the code of the Village of Suffern.

A motion to approve the foregoing resolution was made by Trustee Meegan-Corrigan and seconded by Trustee Osborn, with all in favor.

PUBLIC HEARING

Grant writer Fred Rella explained that this was the Community Development Block Grant (“CDGB”). The CDGB is HUD (Federal) money which goes to the County of Rockland and then gets divided between the Village and other municipalities in Rockland County. It is an application process.

Mr. Rella explained that it was that time of year that the Village needed to apply for a project. They have a Suffern Citizen Advisory Committee, which has been appointed by the Mayor. He announced the committee members. They have to look at a specific area of the municipality, based on 2020 US Census Data, defined as low to moderate income area. There is only one area in the Village and that is in the West Ward. The committee must meet twice.

He reviewed the past projects and announced this year’s project. They chose to pave West Park Place from Ramapo Avenue, the entire length, from Meadow Avenue up to West Maple Avenue.

The estimated cost of this project is \$150 thousand. The cost to the Village will be about 10% of the grant award. We will be asking for \$136 thousand in grant funds and the Village will kick in \$14 thousand.

After the public hearing closes, there will be a resolution before the Board.

Mayor Curley told the public that the area got smaller than what Community Development used to cover in the Village of Suffern. Also, he discussed Ed Fagan Drive which is getting paved now with CDGB funds.

MOTION – To Open the Public Hearing to Consider the Acceptance of the Village of Suffern Citizens Advisory Committee Recommendation for the FY2025 CDBG Grant Application to be Submitted for the West Park Place and Meadow Avenue Paving Project, moved by Trustee Alpert, and seconded by Trustee Meegan-Corrigan with all in favor.

Mayor Curley said that last year the Village received no money, so he asked to be on the committee.

Trustee Alpert asked if HUD was going to be affected by what is going on in Washington DC?

Mr. Rella said yes, he heard that they are looking to reduce the workforce of HUD by approximately 84%.

Mayor Curley added that we are moving forward with Ed Fagan Drive before anything happens. We are trying to get it done as soon as possible.

No comments from the public.

MOTION – To Close the Public Hearing to Consider the Acceptance of the Village of Suffern Citizens Advisory Committee Recommendation for the FY2025 CDBG Grant Application to be Submitted for the West Park Place and Meadow Avenue Paving Project, moved by Trustee Osborn, and seconded by Trustee Hogue, with all in favor.

Consider a Local Law Amending Section 205-3(6) of the Code of the Village of Suffern regarding Vehicle Parking in the Village of Suffern.

Mayor Curley said that the public hearing would continue, he still has the Village Planner working on it and things are changing. We are learning from other communities, and we don't want to let anything slip through the cracks. The public hearing will be adjourned to April 7, 2025.

Mayor Curley said that the Code Enforcers are doing a good job with enforcing things of that nature. People are realizing that you are only allowed one commercial vehicle past the front line of your house, and it can only be so big. You cannot run a business of that nature out of your home, and we are enforcing it.

Trustee Alpert asked about Lot B. He said that about a year ago the duration that's allowed for parking changed from three hours to two. He asked if there was a back story?

Mayor Curley answered “No, it’s a front story. I don’t have any back stories. Just kidding.” Mayor Curley explained that they were giving parking to the businesses and there were no spots for the customers for the support of the local businesses.

Trustee Alpert said that he was asking about 3 hours versus 2 hours.

Mayor Curley said that the signs were corrected.

RESOLUTION NO. 030 OF 2025

AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE CLERK TO ISSUE ADMINISTRATIVE PERMITS FOR OUTDOOR DINING ON VILLAGE SIDEWALKS AND ON PARKING AREAS LOCATED ON OR ADJACENT TO A FULL-SERVICE RESTAURANT IN THE VILLAGE OF SUFFERN

WHEREAS, § 235-7 of the Village Code prohibits the owners and/or occupants of property located within the Village from placing any encumbrances and/or obstructions on sidewalks adjoining their properties and

WHEREAS, § 266-60 of the Zoning Law requires site plan approval for, among other things, “A change in the off-street parking standards for a use as specified in § 266-22, Schedule of General Use Requirements”, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board has had requests from certain full-service restaurant operators within the Village to permit the placement of tables and chairs outside of their establishments, as well as seasonal outdoor planters and containers, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board finds that the use of the Village sidewalks adjacent to and in front of such full-service restaurants by the owners/operators of existing full service restaurants and the use of existing parking areas located on the property or adjacent to that of the owner/operator of an existing full service restaurant for the placement of tables and chairs, and/or seasonal outdoor planters and containers, would be in the interests of the residents of the Village and visitors to the Village to enhance their dining experience and the overall appearance of the Village, and

WHEREAS, the Village Board is desirous of permitting the placement of such items under certain conditions and pursuant to a permit to be issued by the Village Clerk, and

WHEREAS, the Village Clerk’s Office has prepared a proposed permit application for persons or businesses interested in applying for a permit for the placement of such items on the sidewalk under certain conditions.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED, that the Village of Suffern hereby authorizes the Village Clerk to issue Administrative permits for Outdoor Tables and Chairs, and Outdoor Planters and Containers, on Village sidewalks in front of and adjacent to existing full service restaurants and on existing parking areas located on the property or adjacent to that of the owner/operator of an existing full service restaurant based upon the application for permit and the rules as set forth therein, in the form annexed hereto and incorporated by reference herein, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that for sidewalk seating, the building in which the permitted business operates must share a common boundary line with a public sidewalk in the business district; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the outdoor table and chair seating area shall allow a minimum five (5) foot wide unobstructed pedestrian corridor at all times, and a

minimum clearance of five (5) feet must be maintained between the outdoor table and chair seating area in use and the edge of driveways, alleys, and handicapped ramps; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the occupancy of an outdoor sidewalk table and chair seating area will be considered on a case-by-case basis but shall not exceed eight (8) people. Upon the written request of the applicant, however, seating exceeding eight (8) people may be permitted upon the written request of the Applicant with the approval of the Village Board of Trustees following evaluation and recommendations of the Building Department. The maximum occupancy permitted in the outdoor table and chair seating area shall be posted on the exterior of the building in a conspicuous place. The permit holder shall ensure that the number of occupants in the outdoor sidewalk table and chair seating area does not exceed the posted limit at any time; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the maximum number of tables and seats authorized on a permitted parking area shall be determined by the Village Clerk upon consultation with the Building Department; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that nothing may be permanently affixed to a sidewalk or to other public property; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the applicant for a permit shall not be required to provide a formal site plan application to the Planning Board but must provide a sketch plan for its proposed use of the sidewalk or existing parking areas located on the property or adjacent to that of the owner/operator for Outdoor Tables and Chairs, and/or Outdoor Planters and Containers, subject to review and approval by the Village Department of Public Works and the Village Building Department, which sketch plan, upon approval by the Village Clerk and issuance of the permit, shall be followed by the applicant, otherwise being subject to revocation of any permit issued based thereon, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that if located on a parking lot on adjacent property, the applicant will provide a lease, license agreement or written authorization signed by the owner of such adjacent property authorizing such use for the period in question, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the permit holder shall agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Village, and provide insurance coverage to the Village of Suffern in the amount of \$1,000,000.00, and provide proof that the Village of Suffern is a named but non-contributory insured under the permit holder's policy of insurance, proof of same to be required and provided to the Village prior to the issuance of any permit, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that all permit holders are required to comply with all applicable State, County and Village laws and regulations, including but not limited to those of the State Liquor Authority and New York State Uniform Fire Prevention and Building Code, and that any permit issued hereunder is subject to immediate revocation for any violation of the same, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any person or entity who otherwise places tables, chairs, planters, containers or any other object on or in the sidewalk or on existing parking areas located on the property or adjacent to that of the owner/operator shall be subject to the provisions of Village Code Section 235, without a permit, or after having a permit revoked, shall be subject to the enforcement and penalty provisions of Village Code Section 235, and any other remedy and sanction available to the Village, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that any permits issued pursuant hereto, shall be revocable at the discretion of the Village Board, upon a finding that the permit holder has violated the terms of its permit, or that the placement or use of Outdoor Tables and Chairs and/or Outdoor Planters/Containers at a particular location are a nuisance or disturbance, or otherwise negatively impact upon the health, safety and welfare of the community, and that

upon such revocation, the applicant and any other interested parties may be given an opportunity to be heard by the Village Board in an effort to have such permit reinstated upon such conditions as the Village Board shall deem just and appropriate under the circumstances, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this Resolution shall authorize the issuance of Permits by the Village Clerk for a period of one term, from March 15 through October 31 of each year, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all of the terms and conditions of the permit application and permit annexed hereto are incorporated by reference herein and shall be enforceable by the Village with respect to the issuance of said permits.

A motion to approve the foregoing resolution was made by Trustee Meegan-Corrigan and seconded by Trustee Alpert, with all in favor, except Mayor Curley abstained.

**RESOLUTION NO. 031 OF 2025
ACCEPTING THE VILLAGE OF SUFFERN CITIZEN ADVISORY COMMITTEE
RECOMMENDATION FOR THE FY2025 CDBG GRANT APPLICATION TO BE
SUBMITTED FOR THE WEST PARK PLACE AND MEADOW AVENUE PAVING
PROJECT**

RESOLVED, the Village Board of Trustees accept the recommendation of the Village of Suffern Citizen Advisory Committee to seek Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding for the West Park Place and Meadow Avenue Paving Project and authorizes the Mayor or his authorized designee to sign and submit the FY2025 CDBG application for the said project; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, The CDBG application will state that the West Park Place and Meadow Avenue Paving Project cost will be \$150,000. Of this total, \$136,000 will be contributed from the Community Development Block Grant and \$14,000 (approximately 10% of the grant) will be contributed from the Village of Suffern (if a lesser amount of CDBG funds are awarded to the Village of Suffern, the village contribution shall remain constant at no more than 10% of any such CDBG award unless the village deems otherwise, i.e. a \$100,000 award will equate to a \$10,000 Village of Suffern contribution); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, additionally, the Village of Suffern contribution can be the cost of a "project coordinator" and/or Village labor (soft) expenses for the development, implementation and oversight of the West Park Place and Meadow Avenue Paving Project.
